Brief Description of the Organization

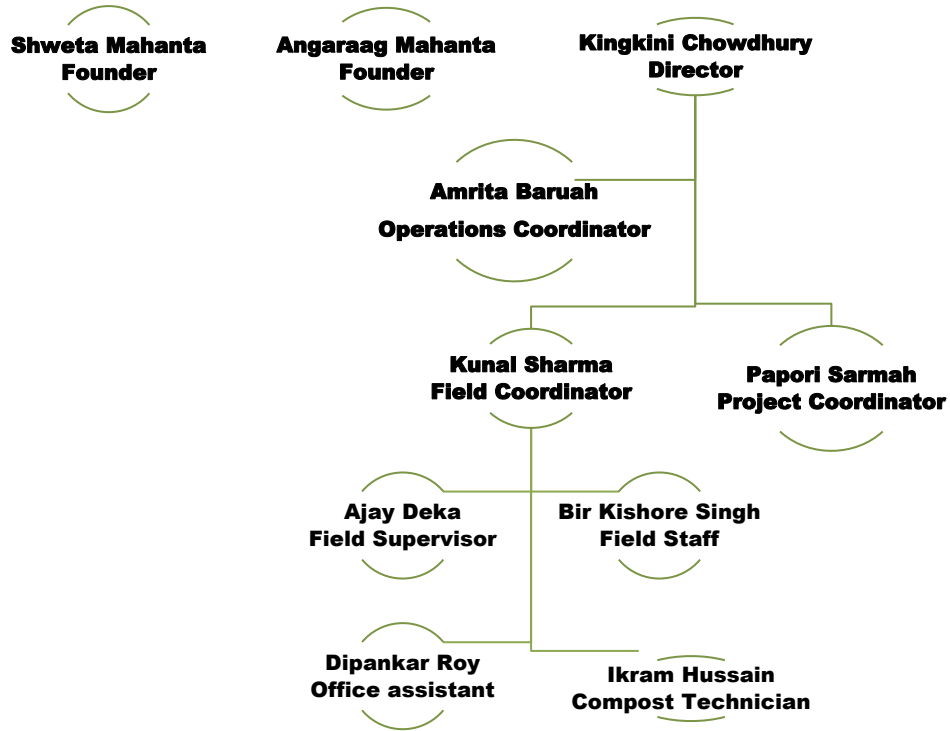

1. The E-waste Detox Drive



The obsolete electronic device at our home and workplace poses serious threat to our health and environment if not discarded properly. They contain toxic substances like mercury, lead, chromium, cadmium, etc. Unsegregated disposal of these devices expose toxic substances to the air, water and soil, which ends up harming our health and

environment.

In an attempt to address this looming problem of E-waste, Earthful Foundation organized an E-waste Detox Drive in Guwahati (Assam) from 4th-12th January 2021. The awareness-cum-collection drive targeted the schools, colleges, offices and housing societies of Guwahati. Awareness Generation amongst masses was done through circulation of posters and videos related to the issue and organization of Webcast and interactive sessions with students. Households, Offices and Educational institutions participated in the drive and reached us for E-waste pickup from their premises. Drop boxes were set up around the city for easy accessibility of people. To encourage people to participate in the drive, we offered certificate of appreciation and gift coupons to them.

The week long drive, managed to create awareness and make a generous collection of 1 ton on E-waste from the city. The collected E-waste was handed over to a PCBA authorized recycling company. Revenue generated from the collected E-waste was used to install solar light in Pub Mayong MV School of Morigaon District, Assam.

2. Ek Prithvi Program in collaboration with 3. WWF-Assam

2.1 Solid Waste Management Program

Under Ek Prithvi- Solid Waste Management program, in 10 schools of Mayong, we offered **Orientation** to students, teachers and staff in which Waste Segregation process was explained through presentation and interaction session. We guided them to segregate their wastes at source so that recyclable material can make its way to recycling plants and the wet waste can be composted and made into manure. We placed **three-coloured dustbins** in the school along with Segregation charts to provide practical experience of segregation to the students. We created a **Compost pit** in the school premises and demonstrated the process of composting to the students. We provided the schools with **Bamboo Cages** where they stored their plastic wastes once the Blue Bin is full.



2.2 Kitchen Garden Program

Under Ek Prithvi – Kitchen Garden Program, Earthful Foundation in collaboration with WWF-India made efforts to make schools self-sufficient by growing their own vegetables. The 'Kitchen Garden' program was initiated in 10 schools in Morigaon district. Here, indigenous and seasonal variety of seeds like Paleng (Spinach) , Lai (Mustard Green), Morisa (Red Amaranth) , Suka (Spinach Dock) Jolokia (Chilli), Dhonia (Coriander), Bengena (Brinjal), Bhendi (Lady's Finger) were sown in designated area of the school, after which the students are handed over the responsibility of taking care of the plants.





3. Flood Relief Activities under Project *Xokaah*

Flood is a yearly experience for people of Assam. Every year a great loss occurs to the people be it life or property. The situation is aggravated by lack of pre-flood preparedness. Also post flood relief measures are often limited due to insufficient funds. Floods are natural phenomenon that can't be stopped; hence preparedness and post flood damage mitigation are of utmost importance in the ground. Earthful Foundation has been actively involved in flood relief activities for last few years under Project "Xokaah".



We distributed reusable kits with basic essentials as pre-flood preparedness measure to few flood prone villages of Assam. The emergency kits we distributed comprise of drinking water, eatables, candles, mosquito repellents, medicines and other essentials to keep them aware and ready before the arrival of the flood.



During floods, we work at the forefront to provide them with their basic necessities. The Flood relief kit we distributed comprise of Eatables like- Rice, daal, salt, cooking oil, biscuit, etc. and essentials like- candle, soap, mosquito repellent, etc. The team distributed food and other essentials after a need based assessment at the relief camp. The team took proper precautions in maintaining social distancing, wearing protective equipment and sanitization.

4. Solar street lighting under Village Adoption Program

The vision of the Village Adoption Program is to create lasting change in the lives of people of the village(s) with special focus on the sectors of Health, Education and Basic amenities which are considered the pillars for Human Development. For us Village Adoption means to work along with the community at the grass root level and enabling them to pursue the goal of development of the village in line with the Sustainable Development Goals and learning as to what works and what doesn't and evolve a model of village development for replication and trainings. The vision of the program is to cover areas like sanitation, water resources, natural resource management, skill up gradation, community mobilization, women group formation, promotion of local handloom and handicrafts, health, education, institutional building, agriculture development for smart agriculture, waste to wealth etc.

In an attempt to bring little light in darkness, Team Earthful installed the first solar powered light in the streets of the Hatigarh Kusiyan village of Morigaon District, under the Village Adoption Program. The street lighting aims to ensure safety of the villagers who live in a highly flood prone region. Also solar powered lights will provide a sustainable energy in the community, which otherwise witness frequent power cuts in electric supply.





From our experiences of flood relief program in the area, we observed that the muddy streets get slippery in rains and during floods the villagers mostly take shelter in those highland roads. The fear of the unknown lingers in those streets without lights at night. Kids and Women are scared to move around in darkness and the streets are more prone to accidents. The streets lights were a great relief to the villagers who were earlier managing with torch lights or mobile flashes.

After the intervention, Youth and elderly now hold meetings/discussions under the lights in the evening. The lights are helpful during festivals, marriages and other such occasions in the village. During flood this year, the street lights were able to provide a sense of security from wild animals that enter the village from the nearby Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary. We are glad to see the village brightened up by smile of the villagers looking up to the lights with hope.

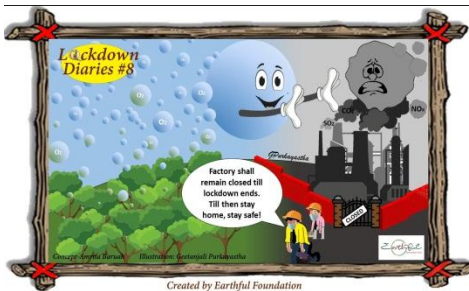
5. Alas! It took decades of age for the father to see the Himalayas from his rooftop.. Thanks to lockdown clearing air pollution.

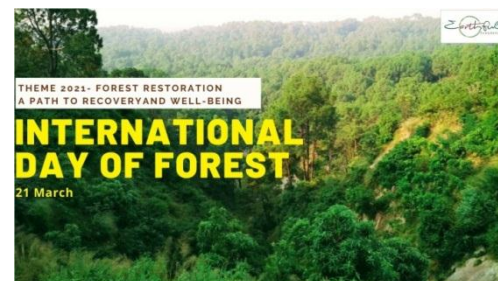


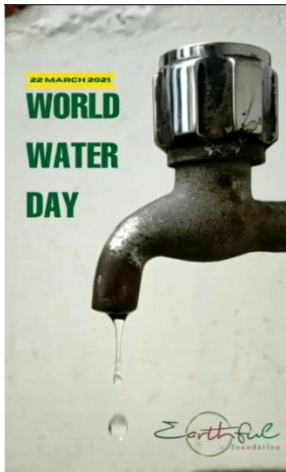
International day of action for rivers: To educate one another about the threats our rivers are facing, and learn about better ways of water and energy solutions.

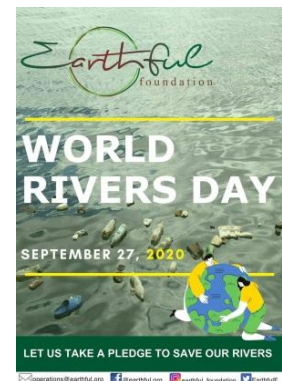
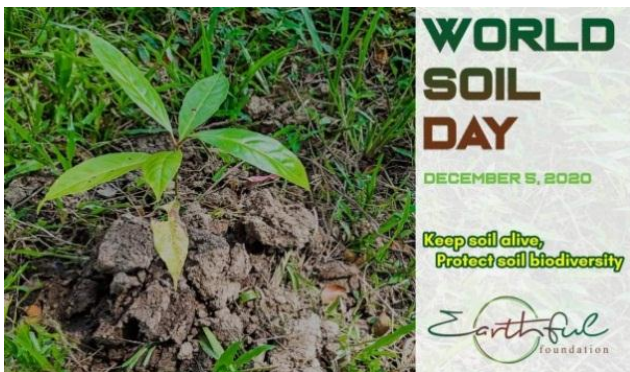
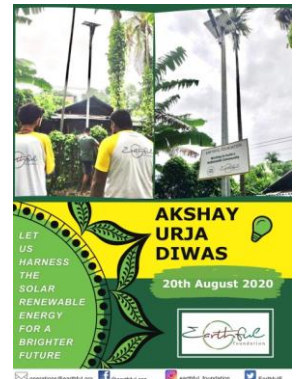
