Brief description of the organization

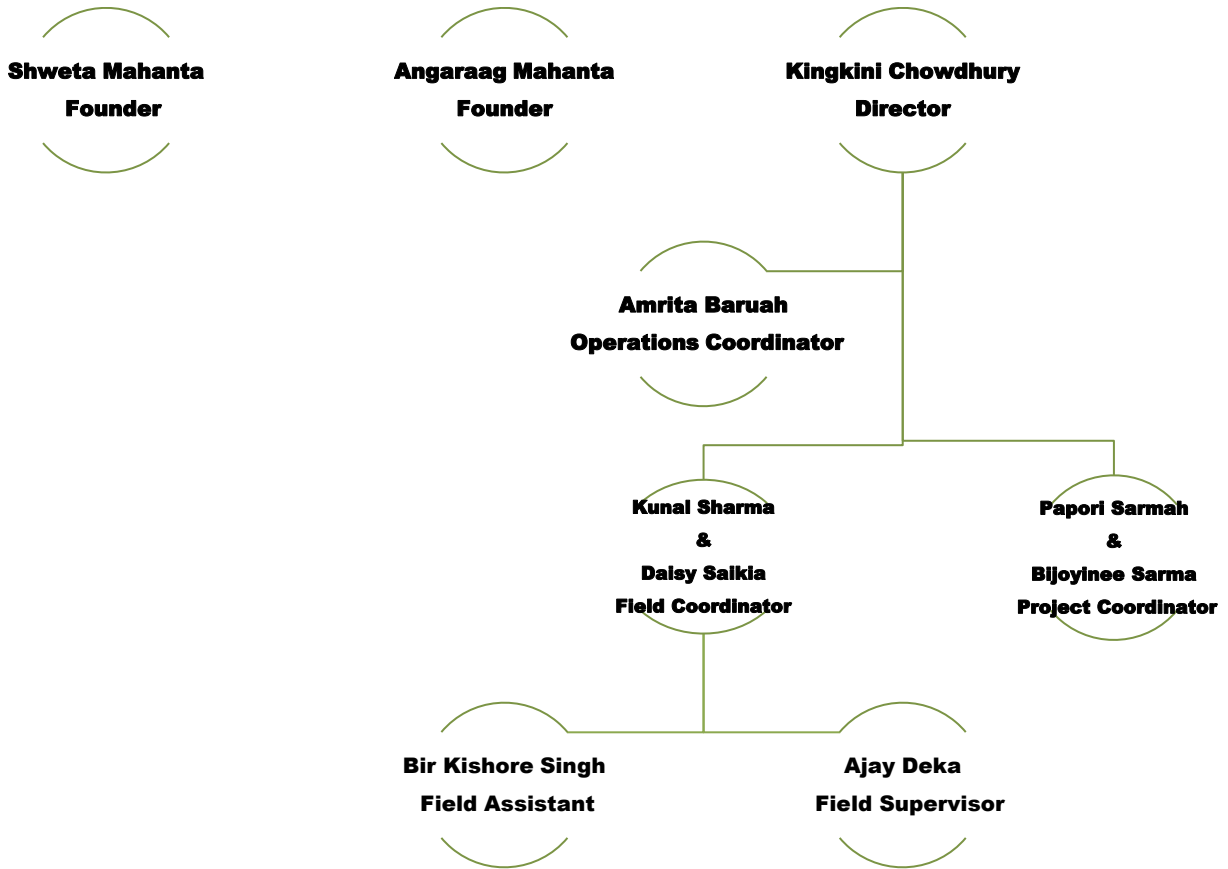

The organization was established with a goal of environmental conservation and implementation of sustainable development principles.

Earthful foundation realizes that people and their livelihood rely on earth and productivity of our landscapes. It works in areas that help conservation of these natural resources and ensure sustainability. Earthful Foundation is dedicated to environmental protection and environmental improvements and in order to achieve this, Earthful is committed to work with different range of stakeholders in order to foster cooperation and joint work for the purpose of achieving sustainable future.

Range of Activities:

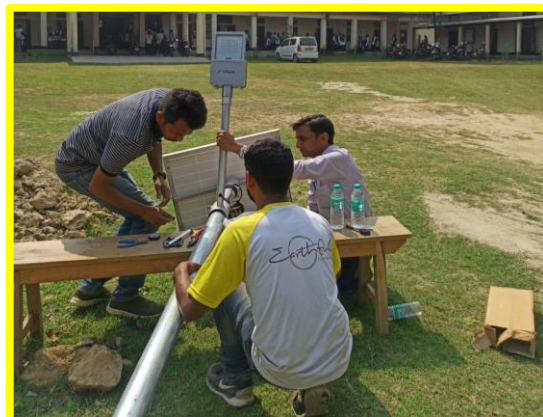

3 April 2021

1. Solar street lighting to promote use of Renewable Energy

In an attempt to promote use of renewable energy and bring little light in darkness, Team Earthful installed solar powered light in Pub Mayong MV School and Mayong Anchalik College, Morigaon district.

The street lighting ensured safety of the villagers who live in a highly flood prone region. Also solar powered lights provided a sustainable energy in the community, which otherwise witness frequent power cuts in electric supply. The funds generated from the E-waste Detox Drive 2021 were utilized to install these street lights.

2. Covid-19 Mitigation Programs

2.1 Covid 19 Helpline

Earthful Foundation formed a helpline number for information on Covid-19 aids. At times, when information about Covid-19 aids flooded in social media, we took initiative to acquaint the callers with information about isolation centers, oxygen, doctors etc. searched, verified and customized for them. The initiative aimed to serve those who were not tech savvy and were in urgent need of support.



2.2 Covid Relief Kits

To make our rural areas equipped with resources and spread awareness for the Covid 19 Crisis, Earthful Foundation distributed "Covid Care kits" to the villagers through the Health Officers of Jhargaon Health Block, Morigaon- Assam. The kits consisted essentials like, pulse-oximeters, N95 masks, 3 ply masks, sanitizers, gloves, medicines etc. and posters with information about Covid 19, in vernacular language that is simple and easy to understand for rural people.

The Covid Care Kit was constructed to give patients easy-to-understand information and the essentials to successfully practice self-care at home, so that they can stay safe and protect their families and communities. Also, by using the Care Kit, the Doctors were able to monitor the patient's health and help them recover from Covid-19.



2.3 Awareness on Covid-19

Earthful Foundation compiled a comprehensive handbook on Covid-19 to create awareness among the people living in rural areas. Written in simple and lucid local language, the handbook catered to a wider section of population and helped them in difficult times.

- Card 2 (Top Middle):** Titled "প্রনিং দেহত অ'ক্সিজেনৰ মাত্রা বঢ়োৱা ব্যায়াম" (Breathing exercises to increase oxygen levels). It provides instructions for various breathing exercises like diaphragmatic breathing and the 4-7-8 technique.
- Card 3 (Top Right):** Titled "গুৰুত্বপূৰ্ণ" (Important). It lists critical actions such as avoiding public places, wearing masks, and avoiding handshakes.
- Card 4 (Middle Left):** Titled "মনত ৰাখিব" (Remember). It emphasizes staying home, avoiding public places, and wearing masks.
- Card 5 (Middle Middle):** Titled "ৰোগ প্ৰতিৰোধক ক্ষমতা বঢ়াবলৈ কিছুমান খৰুৱা উপায়" (Ways to increase disease resistance). It lists healthy habits like eating a balanced diet, drinking water, and getting enough sleep.
- Card 6 (Middle Right):** Titled "ঘৰত কৰিব পৰা কেইটামান সাৱধানতা আৰু উপায়" (Precautions and remedies at home). It provides advice on using masks, hand sanitizers, and natural remedies like turmeric.
- Card 7 (Bottom Left):** Titled "ক'ভিড ১৯ৰ লক্ষনসমূহ" (Symptoms of COVID-19). It lists common symptoms such as fever, cough, and loss of taste or smell.
- Card 8 (Bottom Middle):** Titled "ইয়াৰ বিয়পা প্ৰক্ৰিয়া ৰোধ কৰিবলৈ" (To prevent its spread). It explains the transmission cycle and emphasizes hand hygiene and social distancing.
- Card 9 (Bottom Right):** Titled "ক'ভিড-১৯ কেনেদৰে বিয়পে?" (How does COVID-19 spread?). It details the modes of transmission, including direct contact, droplets, and aerosols.

3. Plantation Drives

Plantation program was carried out by Earthful Foundation at Kalguru Ashram, Nalbari and Bihaguri Higher Secondary School, Tezpur on the occasion of World Environment Day.



4. Project Good Waste

4.1 Guwahati Refinery Township Sector 1



To achieve an efficient waste management system in Guwahati Refinery Township Sector I, Project Good-Waste was inaugurated on the occasion of Swachhta Pakhwara. We held an Orientation program for the residents with an Audio visual show to sensitize them about the waste issue and educate them on ways of segregating their waste.



We conducted Door to door awareness to address each and every person's queries regarding the project. We provided every household a segregation charts for reference of waste segregation. We also distributed the 3 bins in every household before starting the project.



We believe that only awareness of the issue is not enough. To keep the enthusiasm and motivation high, we monitored the segregation process for 14 days, wherein we provided correction and guidance to the residents if required.



Within a week, the township achieved 100% segregation. No waste from the Guwahati Refinery Township Sector 1 was added to the Dump yards. Steps were taken to manage all the wastes within the premises itself.



The Organic waste was composted using the Organic Waste Converter (OWC) and compost was distributed to the residents as a token of appreciation.



The recyclable waste was further segregated into 5 major categories. We stored the waste in different cages so that it can be treated differently. Once the cages were full we contacted the recyclers. The recycler happily took the segregated waste for recycling.



The Unhygienic and Rejected waste was handed over to bio-medical waste recyclers for its safe disposal



This way Guwahati Refinery Township Sector 1 was able to achieve the status of a Zero Waste Zone. The area surrounding the Organic Waste Converter, which was earlier garbage dump yard, was converted into a beautiful garden enriched with the manure created in the OWC.

With a little push, support, and education to improve people's practices and perceptions regarding waste management, Guwahati Refinery Township Sector I is set on the track to transform itself into a model of Environment Sustainability.

4.2 Guwahati Refinery Township Sector 3

After successful completion of 'Project Good Waste' in Sector 1 IOCL, the project was started in Sector 3, Guwahati Refinery Township. The program started with an Orientation for the residents and the housekeeping staff. The aim is to create an efficient waste management system in place and convert the township into a zero-waste zone. Apart from focusing on source segregation, we also emphasized the concept of rinse & recycle for optimum recovery of the waste.



After that we conducted Door to door awareness to address each and every person's queries regarding the project. We provided every household a segregation charts for reference of waste segregation. We also distributed the 3 bins in every household before starting the project.

4.3 Kendriya Vidyalaya IOC Noonmati

Schools carry the responsibility of educating young minds about how to be eco-conscious citizens. Their influential role in the lives of young people means that they have the opportunity to teach good habits that the students will take out into the wider world when they are adults.

With this thought, Earthful Foundation introduced Project Good Waste at Kendriya Vidyalaya, IOC, Noonmati. The Project was inaugurated by respected Chairman VMC & Executive Director IOCL. Colour-coded Dustbins were distributed to all the classes and the students were sensitized to practice Waste Segregation in School and take the knowledge forward to their homes and society.



15 August 2021

5. Clean-up drive on Independence Day

On the occasion of 75th Independence Day, Earthful Foundation collaborated with five other Green groups and took part in a cleanup drive at the Deepor Beel area of Guwahati, Assam. The teams collected various forms of waste, segregated it and sent it to the recycling points. People were urged to care for the environment and to be responsible for their trash.



6. E-waste Detox Programs

6.1 B.Barooah College

The ongoing challenge of how best to dispose the used and unwanted electronic items isn't a new one and is one of the rapidly growing environmental problems of the world. Earthful Foundation in collaboration with B Barooah College conducted an e-waste detox drive and collected the e-wastes from them. The e- waste collected in the drive was handed over to a Pollution Control Board Authorized Recycler for its safe disposal.



6.2. E-waste Detox Program at Suren Das College, Hajo

23 November 2021

Earthful Foundation organized an “E-waste Detox Program” in Suren Das College, Hajo, Guwahati (Assam) from 23rd to 30th November. As a part of the drive, an awareness program was conducted on 25th Nov 2021 in the college with an aim to sensitize students about the issue. The awareness-cum-collection drive managed to collect a generous amount of E-waste from the students and staff. At the end of the drive, the E-waste was collected and handed over to a Pollution Control Board Authorized recycler for its safe disposal. The college was rewarded with a “Certificate of Appreciation” for successfully conducting the drive.

6.3. E-waste Detox Program at Sanskriti The Gurukul, Guwahati

Earthful Foundation successfully conducted an E-waste Detox Program in Sanskriti the Gurukul, Guwahati, wherein the Electronic Wastes in the school were donated to us, so that we can channelize it for proper recycling by PCB authorized recycling agency. We appreciate the school for their generous donation for a noble cause.

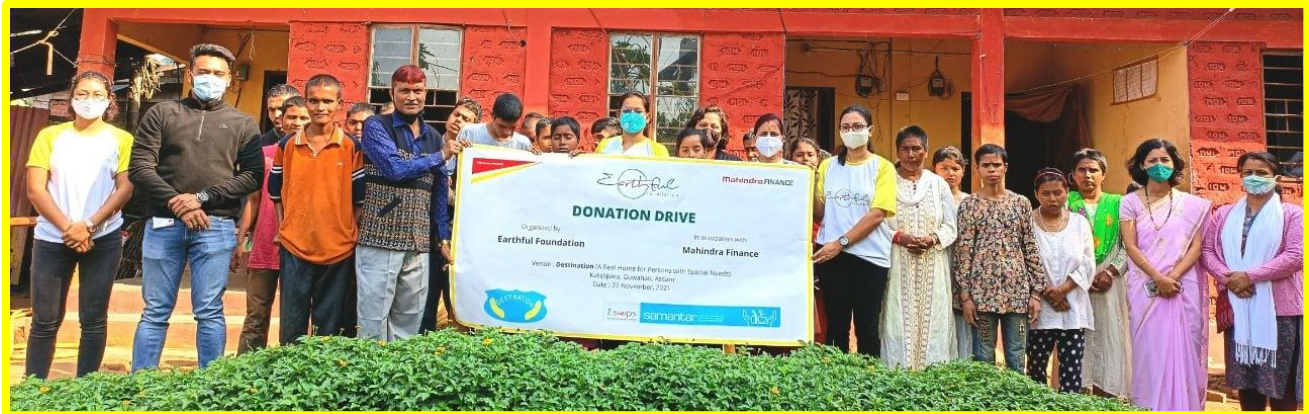
8.3) Distributed reusable clothes to the residents of Destination -a real home for persons with special need on 17th February 2022.

Segregation of Solid Waste Management was also taught to students in the school and the dry waste was collected in cages, whereas the organic waste was composted and used in the Kitchen Garden.

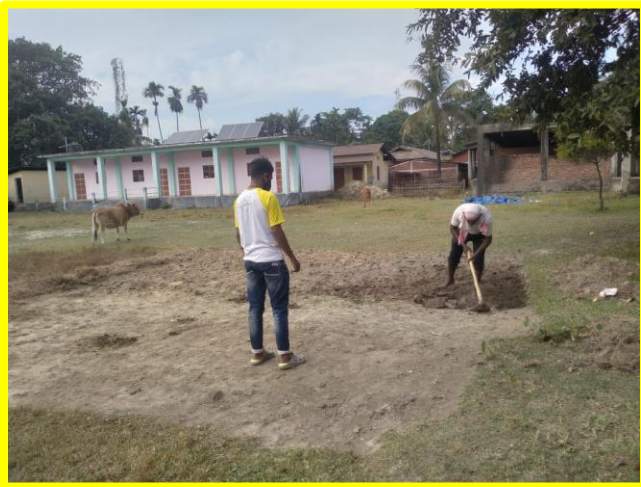

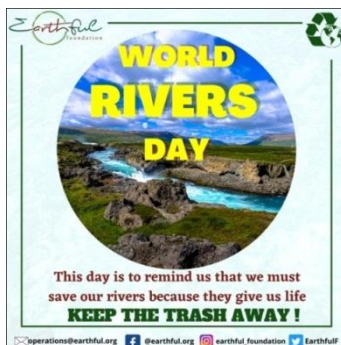
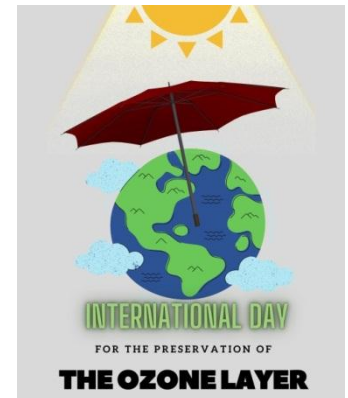
12. Awareness on Environment Conservation through Social Media

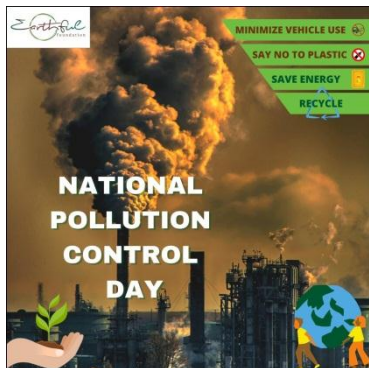

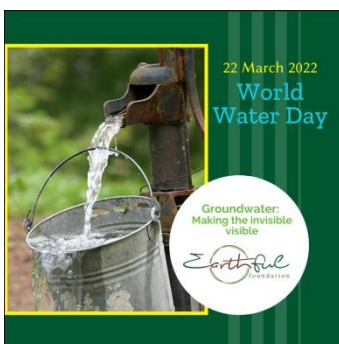

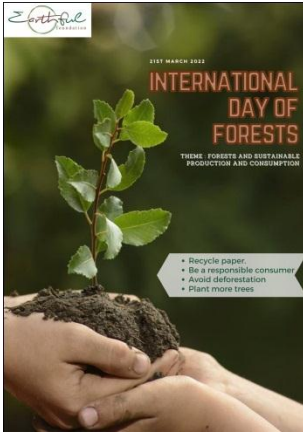

Earthy efforts to make Guwahati Refinery complex waste-free

SHILLONG, Sept 15: A Guwahati-based NGO, Earthful Foundation has launched a drive to convert all the residential sectors of the IOCL Refinery at Guwahati (Noonmati) a 'Zero Waste Zone' under a project called 'Project Good Waste'.

Given that reducing, reusing and recycling can be a key part of a climate change strategy to reduce Greenhouse gas emissions, the Sector I of the refinery complex has been declared Zero Waste Zone under the project by Earthful Foundation.

In the process of its implementation of the project, all the households and workers were approached and given the orientation for segregating their wastes by the volunteers and officials of the NGO which also distributed three coloured dustbins (brown, green and blue) among all the households in the Sector I of the refinery complex for gathering of wastes according their district characters.

The Earthful team would monitor the wastes as 95% of the households agreed to segregate the wastes as they liked the idea. The wet waste would directly go for composting which would be then distributed among the households for their use whereas the inorganic waste would be separated material-wise and sent to the respective vendors for recycling.

The segregation place and the nearby land (dump yard earlier) was cleaned properly and inaugurated as an organic garden. The inauguration of the place was done by Satyajyoti Baruah, Joint Commissioner, GMC and S P Singh, Executive Director, IOCL Guwahati.

Baruah said that this project was a remarkable step and could be a model for many such societies and would be presented in Guwahati Municipal Corporation (GMC) as an example for Waste Management.

S P Singh said that this couldn't have been possible without the support of residents and workers and the project was designed in a suitable way to elicit cooperation needed from the people.




